


What the European Observatory does?

- A pool of evidence that feeds into policy dialogue and country work and shares understanding.




HSPA





Principal Health Reforms

HiTs are the classic flagship series of the Observatory, which are consistent and clearly sign posted, across countries and across time, and provide comparable data to describe and analyze European health systems.









Cross-country HiTs













- Examine different approaches to the organisation, financing and delivery of health services, and the role of actors
- Describe the institutional framework for and the process, content and implementation of health policy;
- Highlight challenges and areas requiring more detailed analysis;
- Provide a tool for disseminating information on health systems;
- Facilitate the exchange of reform experiences across countries;
- Establish a baseline for assessing the impact of reforms; and
- Inform comparative analysis and teaching.






